

Front Panel Controls

FRONT PANEL



1. INPUT CHANNEL EQUALIZE CONTROLS

These controls allow to equaliza the input signal from -12dB to +12dB at 80Hz(LOW),2.5kHz(MID) and 12.5kHz(HIGH) for CH1~CH4.

2. SIGNAL INDICATORS

These indicators show current input signal on each of the input channels.

3. PEAK INDICATORS

These indicators warn against overload on the each input channels. Please adjust the TRIM on the rear panel when PEAK indicators are flickering for best performance.

4. INPUT CHANNEL VOLUME

These allow to adjust for each input level adjustment

5. OUTPUT CHANNEL SELECTORS

These selectors to route input channel signals to output channels

6. OUTPUT CHANNEL EQ CONTROLS

Output channels have two band equalizer which is adjustable over a wide range as follow.

HIGH: ±15dB at 12KHz/LOW: ±15dB at 80Hz

7. OUTPUT LEVEL METER

These indicators show current output level.

8. CLIP INDICATORS

These indicators warn against overload on the each output chan-nels. Please adjust the VOLUME control when CLIP indicators are flicking for best performance.

9. MUTE SWITCH

These buttons allow to mute each output channels.

10. OUTPUT VOLUME

These faders allow to adjust the level of each output channels.

11. POWER INDICATOR

This indicator lights when power switch is turned on.

12. POWER SWITCH

This button is power on/off switch.

13. MONITOR SWITCH

These switches allow you to monitor each output channel through monitor speaker.

14. MONITOR OUTPUT CONTROL


This control allow to adjust the level of monitor speaker.

15. MONITOR SPEAKER

16.PFC/ATL SELECTOR

This control allow you to select monitor before or after master volume.

Rear Panel Controls



1. AC POWER INPUT CONNECTOR

Acorrect capacity fuse and power cable should always be used. Please make sure the value of fuse before replacing.

2. REMOTE INPUT

The RJ45 connector allows connection with RWP1(wall control panel) for ad-justing volume and inserting music source of remote area.



3. LINE OUTPUTS

These LINE output blocks can be connected to the input of a power amplifier.

4. TRIM CONTROLS

These controls allow to accept variable input level. They have 44dB adjustable range as -50dB to -6dB for microphone input channels and -30dB to +14dB for line input channels.

5. SIGNAL INPUTS

This mixer provide several connectors for signal input and these connectors allow easy connection. Channels 1~4 are balanced line and microphone input and channel 5~8 are mono line input.

6. TALKOVER SWITCH

All other input signals are muted by the input signal of channel 1 auto-matically when this switch pressed on.

7. PHANTOM POWER SWITCH

The phantom power can be provided to each microphone input for using condenser microphone.

8. EXT.MUTE

Mutes input signals fed to CH1~CH4 muting function by short-circuiting at these terminals.

9. DC 24V INPUT & LINK TERMINAL


If connected to DC 24V. These terminals are provided for the connection of 24V DC power source. 24V DC battery source can be connected to these terminal. The device will supply power to other device by the link output terminal.

10. REMOTE MIC INPUT

The RJ45 connector allows connection for the RWP-4(desktop remote microphone) for individual zone announcement.
